## Good news for Canterbury

Canterbury Mayors welcome direct flights from Guangzhou to Christchurch on China Southern Airlines

From Wednesday 16 December 2015, China Southern Airlines will bring three flights a week into Christchurch, each with an average capacity of 228 passengers (35,568 one-way seats over a 12-month period).

Direct flights are a boon to Canterbury's economy, as wide-bodied jets also carry our high-value and time-sensitive produce out to our markets in Asia.

The direct flights from Guangzhou to Christchurch are in addition to flights into Auckland (see the table below). All up, seat supply has increased by 37% from 2014/15 so we expect big things, including an increase in tourist spending of over \$100 million.



We expect a large influx of visitors to celebrate Chinese New Year on 8 February 2016 and usher in the Year of the Monkey.

Christchurch & Canterbury Tourism is preparing welcome signs for Canterbury businesses to use for Chinese New Year.
